A LETTER FROM THE NURSE:



Dear Parent/Guardians,

It is that time of year where we may see an increase in head lice. We wanted to share some helpful information with you! Should you have any questions, please contact the school health office.

Head lice typically live close to the scalp, behind the ears, or at the base of the neck. The main symptom is *itching*.

Head lice spreads from direct head-to-head contact with another individual that has a live infestation. Less frequently, contact with personal belongings, such as combs, hairbrushes, towels, pillowcases, and hats can harbor lice. As Spring approaches, remind your children **not** to share hats, helmets and clothing of others!

A person can spread lice as long as live lice remain in the hair of that individual and the live lice are within ¼" from the scalp. Lice depend on human blood for survival and can't survive for more than 48 hours away from the scalp.

If your student has live head lice:

- Use an over-the-counter pediculicide (lice shampoo) as directed on the package. Retreatment with the same pediculicide may be necessary, according to the instructions on the package (usually 7-10 days after the first treatment). Repetitive use of over-thecounter head lice treatment is not recommended. Contact your healthcare provider if one round of treatment does not work.
- Use a lice comb to remove all nits (eggs)
- Household members should be evaluated for head lice, and if live lice are found, they should also be treated.
- Launder household items in hot, soapy water and dried with high heat. Hairbrushes/combs should be thoroughly cleaned or boiled. Running items through the dishwasher is another option.
- Insecticide treatment of the home or vehicle is not indicated, but vacuuming those areas is helpful.

Dime = -10


Quarter = -25
